Under the weight of manipulated social pressure, hunting opportunities continue to be eliminated here in BC and around the world. In recent years, we have witnessed the loss of the grizzly bear hunt due to social pressure, instead of science-based management. We have come to learn of a new threat to sound wildlife management by well-funded organizations, who put emotional management at the forefront of their agenda.

"Once again hunting is under attack by socially pressured campaigns" said Kyle Stelter, WSSBC Past President." We implore our elected officials to make decisions based on science and evidence, and truly put sound wildlife management practices first in British Columbia."

Named by this latest campaign are 'large carnivores'- specifically black bears, cougars and wolves.

The Wild Sheep Society is against any wildlife or habitat decisions that are not backed by science and that are not evidence based, and as such- are asking for the support of all our members and dedicated conservationists to engage with your elected officials before decisions are made that will again change the face of wildlife management in British Columbia.

Hunters are the original conservationists- and as such, would back any closures deemed necessary by science. The future of responsibly managed wildlife and habitat depends on it. We need the voice of our elected officials to put wildlife first in British Columbia, instead of as a campaign promise.
